





Provider Express - Clinical Resources - Coordination of Care

Coordination of care among behavioral health clinicians and medical care providers improves the quality of patients' care



Six ways to improve coordination of care:

- At the initial session, discuss what coordination of care is and invite your patient to ask questions they may have about the process
- Engage and inform your patient about the importance and benefits of coordinating their care with other health care professionals
- Document the discussion notes in the patient chart
- Provide the appropriate assessment information to other treatment professionals, with the appropriate permissions and releases on file
- Request that the other treating professional provide you with relevant clinical information including medical, mental health or substance use treatment they are providing
- Document actions in the patient progress notes, including if the patient declined to allow coordination of care

Effectively coordinating care between these treatment professionals can lead to improved health outcomes, reduce health care costs, and benefit practitioners by enhancing networking with other professionals.

Medication Assisted Treatment has a new name

Medication for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) and Medication for Alcohol Use Disorder (MAUD): MOUD-MAUD

The concern with using Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) comes from the role medication has in addiction treatment:

- Medication was first used as an add-on to the usual treatments
- The primary approach for many years has been abstinence with counseling/therapy and self-help support, which addresses how thoughts, emotions and behaviors work together
- From this viewpoint, medication has had a supporting role

Now, research has backed medication as an effective standalone treatment:

- Current methods now use medication with or without counseling/therapy
- It is considered a safe and effective treatment on its own
- This treatment method is MOUD-MAUD
